UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

H.R. 2419 (ORDER NO. 339)

1.—Ordered, That at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, December 14, 2007, the Senate resume consideration of H.R. 2419, an act to provide for the continuation of agricultural programs through fiscal year 2012, and for other purposes.

Ordered further, That all time during any recess or adjournment of the Senate count post cloture.

Ordered further, That the following amendments be debated for the time limits specified, with all time equally divided and controlled in the usual form, with no amendments in order to any amendments covered under the agreement prior to a vote in relation to the amendment:

Amdt. No. 3687, offered by the Senator from Texas (Mr. Cornyn)-30 minutes; Amdt. No. 3807, offered by the Senator from Oklahoma (Mr. Coburn)-70 minutes.

Ordered further, That in any vote sequence, there be two minutes of debate equally divided prior to each vote, and that after the first vote in any sequence, the succeeding votes be limited to 10 minutes.

Ordered further, That, other than the pending amendments, there be a limitation of 20 first degree amendments per side and that they be from the list that follows:

Ordered further, That Managers' amendments cleared by both Managers not be counted toward the 20 first degree amendments allowed by the agreement; provided, that the Managers' package of cleared amendments be considered and agreed to and the motion to reconsider be laid upon the table.

Ordered further, That the cloture vote on H.R. 2419, be delayed, if needed, to occur upon the adoption of Amdt. 3500.

Ordered further, That the mandatory quorum call required under Rule XXII be waived with respect to the cloture motion filed on the bill. (Nov. 14, Dec. 5, 6, 7, 10, 11, 12, 13, 2007.)

VETO MESSAGE ON S. 5

2.—Ordered, That the veto message on S. 5, the Stem Cell Research Enhancement Act of 2007, be considered as read and that it be printed in the Record and spread in full upon the Journal.

Ordered further, That the message be held at the desk. (June 20, 2007.)

H.R. 3997

3.—Ordered, That if the Senate receives from the House a message on H.R. 3997, an act to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to provide earnings assistance and tax relief to members of the uniformed services, volunteer firefighters, and Peace Corps volunteers, and for other purposes, with an amendment that is not germane to the Senate amendment or the underlying bill, that the bill and its amendments be referred to the Committee on Finance. (Dec. 12, 2007.)

S. 2338 (ORDER NO. 481)

4.—*Ordered*, That upon disposition of H.R. 2419, the Senate proceed to the consideration of S. 2338, an original bill to modernize and update the National Housing Act and enable the Federal Housing Administration to more effectively reach underserved borrowers, and for other purposes.

Ordered further, That the only first degree amendments in order be the following, and that the time for debate for the amendment offered by the Senator from Oklahoma (Mr. Coburn) be limited to 60 minutes equally divided and controlled in the usual form:

An amendment offered by the Senator from Connecticut (Mr. Dodd) and the Senator from Alabama (Mr. Shelby), relating to a moratorium;

An amendment offered by the Senator from Oklahoma (Mr. Coburn), relating to reverse mortgages.

Ordered further, That there be 30 minutes of general debate on the bill, equally divided and controlled in the usual form.

Ordered further, That upon the use or yielding back of all time and the disposition of all amendments, the bill be read a third time, and the Senate proceed to vote on passage of the bill. (Dec. 13, 2007.)
