UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

S. 2248 (ORDER NO. 512)

1.—Ordered, That at 10:00 a.m. on Monday, December 17, 2007, the Senate resume the motion to proceed to S. 2248, an original bill to amend the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act of 1978, to modernize and streamline the provisions of that act, and for other purposes, with the time until 12 noon equally divided and controlled between the two Leaders or their designees, with the Senator from Connecticut (Mr. Dodd) controlling 40 minutes and the Senator from Wisconsin (Mr. Feingold) controlling 15 minutes of the opponents' time.

Ordered further, That at 12 noon, the Senate proceed to vote on the cloture motion on the motion to proceed to S. 2248, and that the mandatory quorum required under

Rule XXII be waived. (Dec. 14, 2007.)

VETO MESSAGE ON S. 5

2.—Ordered, That the veto message on S. 5, the Stem Cell Research Enhancement Act of 2007, be considered as read and that it be printed in the Record and spread in full upon the Journal.

Ordered further, That the message be held at the desk. (June 20, 2007.)

3.—Ordered, That if the Senate receives from the House a message on H.R. 3997, an act to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to provide earnings assistance and tax relief to members of the uniformed services, volunteer firefighters, and Peace Corps volunteers, and for other purposes, with an amendment that is not germane to the Senate amendment or the underlying bill, that the bill and its amendments be referred to the Committee on Finance.
