UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

H.R. 1585 (ORDER NO. 189)

1.—Ordered, That when the Senate resumes consideration of the Amdt. No. 2997, offered by the Senator from Delaware (Mr. Biden), to H.R. 1585, an act to authorize appropriations for fiscal year 2008 for military activities of the Department of Defense, for military construction, and for defense activities of the Department of Energy, to prescribe military personnel strengths for such fiscal year, and for other purposes, there be 30 minutes of debate equally divided and controlled between Senator Biden and Senator McCain, or their designees, prior to a vote in relation to the amendment, with no amendment in order to the amendment prior to the vote; provided, that the amendment be subject to a 60 vote threshold, and that if it does not achieve that threshold, the amendment be withdrawn. (Sept. 20, 2007.)

HOUSE MESSAGE ON H.R. 976

2.—Ordered, That on Wednesday, September 26, 2007, when cloture is filed on the motion to concur in the House amendments to the Senate amendments to H.R. 976, the Children's Health Insurance Program Reauthorization Act of 2007, that it then be considered to have been filed on Tuesday and the mandatory quorum be waived, notwithstanding Rule XXII. (Sept. 25, 2007.)

VETO MESSAGE ON S. 5

3.—Ordered, That the veto message on S. 5, the Stem Cell Research Enhancement Act of 2007, be considered as read and that it be printed in the Record and spread in full upon the Journal.
