Dear Senator Lugar:

On behalf of the Jewish Federation of Greater Indianapolis and the Indianapolis NORCs: Elder-Friendly Communities, we want to thank you and your staff for supporting our NORC Supportive Service Program demonstration request over the past several years.

Your support for this project provided the spark for what has become an extraordinarily wide-ranging and well-respected aging-in-place demonstration project. We have forged relationships with State agencies who are looking to us to play a consultative and training role replicating the NORC model to underserved communities in throughout the State.

The timing of our request coincides with the aging of the Baby Boomers, who will rely in growing numbers on community-based providers, such as ours, to deliver better, more efficient, and effective services to meet their needs. Our country's system of long-term care will depend on such improvements if we, as a nation, are to properly maintain our quality of care for our senior citizens, in the wake of the Baby Boom.

As such, we seek your continued support for our NORC Supportive Service Program demonstration request in FY2009. Accompanying this letter is our formal proposal for FY2009, which requests a grant of \$750 thousand.

Securing a NORC demonstration project grant in FY2009 would enable us to further develop best practices, guidelines, models, tools, and important evaluative research and data to improve our ability to deliver services to the aged and enrich the lives of our elderly clients. Additionally, with a demonstration project, we would broadly disseminate the body of knowledge, research, and methodologies that is derived from this experience within the Aging Network at home. Likewise, we would continue to contribute to the growing body of work to come out of the national initiative, intended to provide national public policy makers with innovative solutions to meet the extraordinary demands the baby boomers are expected to place on the nation's existing long term care systems.




