Congresswoman Sánchez is fighting to keep good jobs on American soil. As a sponsor of the “Defending American Jobs Act of 2004” (H.R. 3888), she is working to prevent companies from receiving federal funds if they lay-off American workers while creating jobs overseas.

Sánchez is also sponsoring the “The United States Workers Protection Act” (H.R. 3820), which would prohibit taxpayer dollars from being used to outsource work currently done in the United States.

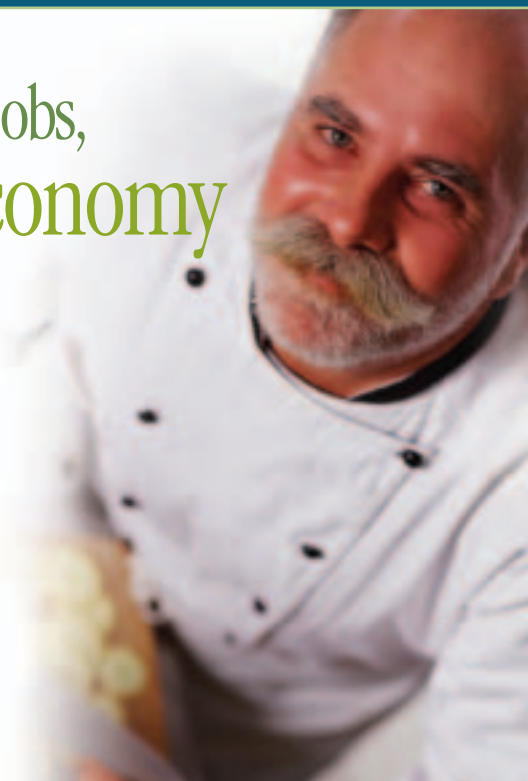
Helping FAMILIES COPE with Tough Times

Unemployment benefits not only help those still looking for work, they also stimulate economic growth and create new jobs – pumping \$1.73 into the economy for every \$1.00 spent. Through the “Emergency Unemployment Compensation Act” (H.R. 3244), Sánchez is fighting to extend benefits from 13-to-26 weeks for unemployed workers.

CREATING More Jobs, Boosting Our Local Economy

Congresswoman Sánchez is sponsoring a bill called “Job Protection Act of 2003” (H.R. 1769), which will help revitalize America’s manufacturing base by lowering tax rates on all domestic producers – including small business and farms – by 3.5 percent. She has also delivered more than \$5.5 million in federal funding for several important projects in our district – helping to create local jobs and improve our quality of life.
