Maintaining Safe Schools

For too long, bullying has been an overlooked problem. Bullying takes away students' ability to learn, feel safe, and develop strong self-esteem. That's why I wrote the "School Safety and Violence Protection Act." The bill would provide grants to states that implement comprehensive anti-bullying programs, and would create a statewide hotline for anonymous reporting by students and staff with information on bullying.

Constructing More Schools

Overcrowded schools, crumbling classrooms, teachers in trailers—our kids need better schools! That's why I support the "Better Classroom Act of 2003" (H.R. 717) which will encourage communities to construct new schools and renovate older ones.

Recruiting and Retaining Teachers

I'm sponsoring the "Teacher Recruitment and Retention Act" (H.R. 1751) in order to attract and train more teachers. We need to ease the burden of student loans for new teachers so they can afford to stay in the classroom.

Protecting Head Start

Head Start is in serious danger. That's why I opposed the "School Readiness Act of 2003" (H.R. 2210). The legislation is an attempt to cut Head Start instead of protecting the program for future generations.

Expanding College Opportunities

Everyone should have the opportunity to go to college. That's why I'm sponsoring the "Access to Higher Education Act of 2003," (H.R. 2505) that permits refinancing of student consolidation loans and increases Pell Grant awards to \$7,000.
