### **USCCR REPORT EXAMINES INCIDENTS OF CAMPUS ANTI-SEMITISM**

*Commission report probes campus anti-Semitism, including recommendations to end such incidents at our nation's colleges*

WASHINGTON, DC – The U.S. Commission on Civil Rights today released *Campus Anti-Semitism*, a 76-page report detailing the continuing and disturbing incidents of anti-Semitism on many college campuses throughout the United States. The report includes a number of findings and recommendations, originally issued to the public on April 3, 2006. The report announces that anti-Semitism on American campuses today “is a serious problem which warrants further attention.” Moreover, the report emphasizes “anti-Semitic bigotry is no less morally deplorable when camouflaged as anti-Israelism or anti-Zionism.” Evidence presented in the report was gathered from oral presentations by a panel of experts and the subsequent discussion at the November 18, 2005, Commission meeting as well as numerous written submissions to the Commission by organizations, academic institutions, and other interested parties.
