The committee met, pursuant to notice, at 12:18 p.m., in Room S-219, The Capitol, Hon. Dianne Feinstein, Chairman of the committee, presiding.

Chairman Feinstein. The Committee is called to order. A quorum is now present with 10 members physically present.

Yesterday the Committee held a hearing on the nominations of Cynthia L.

Bauerly, Caroline C. Hunter, and Donald F. McGahn to be members of the Federal Election Commission.

After receiving testimony from the nominees and a question and answer session, the hearing was adjourned.

Since a quorum of ten Members was not present when we began the markup yesterday, the Committee was recessed to reconvene today following a vote.

During the hearing, I told my Ranking Member, Senator Bennett, that if he requested, I would consider the three nominations en bloc by voice vote. He agreed.

If not, I will entertain the following motion: that the three nominations be ordered reported to the Senate with the recommendation that they be approved.

Senator Bennett. I move, Madame Chair.

Chairman Feinstein. Is there a second?

[A chorus of speakers.] I second.

Chairman Feinstein. All in favor, say aye.

[A chorus of ayes.]

Chairman Feinstein. Those opposed, say nay.

[No response.]

Chairman Feinstein. The ayes have it, and the motion is agreed to.

The nominations are ordered reported with a recommendation that they be confirmed.

The Committee is adjourned.
