## A BILL

To provide for homeland security grant coordination and simplification.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Homeland Security
- 5 Grant Coordination and Simplification Act of 2003".
- 6 SEC. 2. INTERAGENCY COMMITTEE TO COORDINATE AND
- 7 STREAMLINE HOMELAND SECURITY GRANT
- 8 PROGRAMS.
- 9 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Homeland Security Act of
- 10 2002 is amended by inserting after section 801 the fol-
- 11 lowing:

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1	"SEC. 802. INTERAGENCY COMMITTEE TO COORDINATE
2	AND STREAMLINE HOMELAND SECURITY
3	GRANT PROGRAMS.
4	"(a) Establishment.—There is established an
5	Interagency Committee to Coordinate and Streamline
6	Homeland Security Grant Programs (in this section re-
7	ferred to as the 'Interagency Committee') that shall—
8	"(1) ensure coordination among the Federal
9	agencies that provide funding or other assistance to
10	or for—
11	"(A) State and local law enforcement
12	agencies;
13	"(B) fire and rescue operations;
14	"(C) medical and emergency relief services;
15	and
16	"(D) State and local homeland security ef-
17	forts;
18	"(2) eliminate duplication of requirements con-
19	tained in emergency plans requested by Federal
20	agencies;
21	"(3) simplify and coordinate applications for
22	homeland security funding;
23	"(4) identify ways to streamline the process
24	through which Federal agencies support community-
25	based law enforcement, fire and rescue, and medical
26	and emergency relief services;

1	"(5) collect information regarding State and							
2	local initiatives to promote interoperability of equip-							
3	ment;							
4	"(6) develop coordinated plans to provide tech-							
5	nical assistance to States to promote interoperable							
6	equipment;							
7	"(7) provide coordinated assistance to help							
8	States and local governments prepare risk and vul-							
9	nerability assessments; and							
10	"(8) review State plan submissions to ensure							
11	that all relevant Federal interests are protected.							
12	"(b) Membership.—The Interagency Committee							
13	shall be composed of—							
14	"(1) a representative of the Office for Domestic							
15	Preparedness;							
16	"(2) a representative of the Health Resources							
17	and Services Administration of the Department of							
18	Health and Human Services;							
19	"(3) a representative of the Centers for Disease							
20	Control and Prevention of the Department of Health							
21	and Human Services;							
22	"(4) a representative of the Directorate of							
23	Emergency Preparedness and Response;							
24	"(5) a representative of the United States							
25	Coast Guard;							

1	"(6) a representative of the Department of De-
2	fense;
3	"(7) a representative of the Directorate of Bor-
4	der and Transportation Security;
5	"(8) a representative of the Department of
6	Transportation;
7	"(9) a representative of the Community Ori-
8	ented Policing Services of the Department of Jus-
9	tice;
10	"(10) a representative of the Office of Justice
11	Programs of the Department of Justice;
12	"(11) a representative of the Federal Commu-
13	nications Commission;
14	"(12) a representative of the Environmental
15	Protection Agency; and
16	"(13) a representative of the Office of Public
17	Safety of the Department of Commerce; and
18	"(14) representatives of any other Federal
19	agency identified by the President as having a sig-
20	nificant role relating to the purposes of the Inter-
21	agency Committee.
22	"(c) Administration.—The Department shall pro-
23	vide administrative support to the Interagency Committee
24	which shall include—
25	"(1) scheduling meetings;

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- 2 "(3) maintaining minutes and records; and
- 3 "(4) producing reports.
- 4 "(d) Leadership.—The Secretary shall designate a
- 5 chairperson of the Interagency Committee.
- 6 "(e) Meetings.—The Interagency Committee shall
- 7 meet—
- 8 "(1) at the call of the Secretary; or
- 9 "(2) not less frequently than once every 3
- months.".
- 11 (b) Technical and Conforming Amendment.—
- 12 The table of contents for the Homeland Security Act of
- 13 2002 is amended by inserting after the item relating to
- 14 section 801 the following:
