Notice if hereby given that the 1 Copyright Office seal may in the future be affixed by the Copyright Office to

certain certificates of registration by means of a printing process rather than by the embossing process that has been, and is now, in use. This change has been adopted in order to help accelerate the issuance of certificates of registration.

The embossing process may, however, continue to be used to affix the seal to some certificates of registration and to other certifications. The method of affixation of the seal is intended to have no bearing upon the authenticity of any certificate or other certification issued by the Copyright Office. The seal will be

affixed, in all cases, under the same supervision and safeguards as in the past.
