Dear Mr. Longhurst:

The United States Senate Committee on Finance (Committee) has jurisdiction over the Medicare and Medicaid programs. As a senior member of the United States Senate and as Ranking Member of the Committee, I have a special responsibility to protect the health of Medicare and Medicaid beneficiaries and safeguard taxpayer dollars authorized by Congress for these programs. This includes the responsibility to conduct oversight of the medical industry, including the independence of medical education programs.

In carrying out this duty, I seek to learn more about how Continuing Medical Education (CME) programs work in the medical device industry, and how they ensure their independence from industry. I understand that your organization, Broadwater, is a medical education services company with close ties to Medtronic, America's largest maker of medical devices. For this reason, I request that your company brief my staff on Broadwater's practices and on medical education in general.

In cooperating with the Committee's inquiry, no documents, records, data, or other information related to these matters, either directly or indirectly, shall be destroyed, modified, removed, or otherwise made inaccessible to the Committee. In addition, we would appreciate your identifying a Broadwater representative with whom we can discuss matters relating to your company as soon as possible.
