Comment:

As a professional who generates intellectual property I appreciate the various forms of protection given to these, including copyright protection. However, the original intent was to secure for a limited time to authors and inventors various rights in order to promote publication and both the short term commercial interests and the longer term public interests which most definitely included having works fall into the public domain.

So-called "Orphaned works" are being excluded from the public domain AND excluded from commercial exploitation which could generate revenues for authors. Allowing some kind of use to exist, with a provision for those holding legitimate interests in the works to be recompensed, should they come forward and desire such compensation, perhaps along the model of compensating for public playing of songs over radio channels, would be to the benefit of all.
