The 2003-2004 *U.S. Government Manual* Now Available Online and in Print

Washington, DC—If you want information about the legislative, judicial and executive branches of our Federal Government, there is one publication that has it all. The official handbook of the Federal Government, the *United States Government Manual* provides comprehensive information on the agencies of all three branches of Government.

The *Government Manual* also includes information about boards, commissions and committees. In addition, the publication also has details on quasi-official agencies, international organizations in which the United States participates.

The *Government Manual* is published by the Office of the Federal Register, a unit of the National Archives and Records Administration, and is made available to the public online and in print through the GPO.

The *Government Manual* is available as ASCII text and Adobe Portable Document Format (PDF) files. You can retrieve information by searching the *U.S. Government Manual* database or browsing a list of documents in table format.
