<p>Warning</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ★ Describes the warning systems and responsibilities and procedures for using these systems. 	
<p>Emergency Public Information</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ★ Describes policies, roles, responsibilities, and procedures for increasing public awareness of the hazards and the need for individual and family preparedness. Provides a means for informing populations at risk about the danger and explaining the appropriate protective steps they should take before, during, and after an emergency. 	<p>The Public Information Annex to the FRP indicates that Federal representatives in the Joint Information Center (JIC) will coordinate with the State before releasing information to the public. Under ESF-6, the American Red Cross provides a Disaster Welfare Information service.</p>
<p>Evacuation</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ★ Describes policies, roles, responsibilities, and procedures for evacuating people and critical supplies from a risk area when emergency conditions make such actions necessary. ★ Describes areas likely to be evacuated, determines destinations, travel routes, methods of travel, and the approach for controlling the flow of evacuees. 	<p>ESF-1 Transportation</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ★ Provides transportation support to move evacuees upon request.
<p>Mass Care</p> <p>Describes the policies, roles, responsibilities, and procedures for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ★ Providing shelter to protect people from the effects of the disaster. ★ Providing housing, food, clothing, first aid, and other essentials to the people that have been displaced from their homes by the disaster. 	<p>ESF-6 Mass Care</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ★ Provides tents, other temporary shelters, food and feeding units, first aid services, and disaster welfare information to help displaced family members upon request.
	<p>ESF-11 Food</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ★ Coordinates with State officials to determine the food needs of the population in the disaster area.
