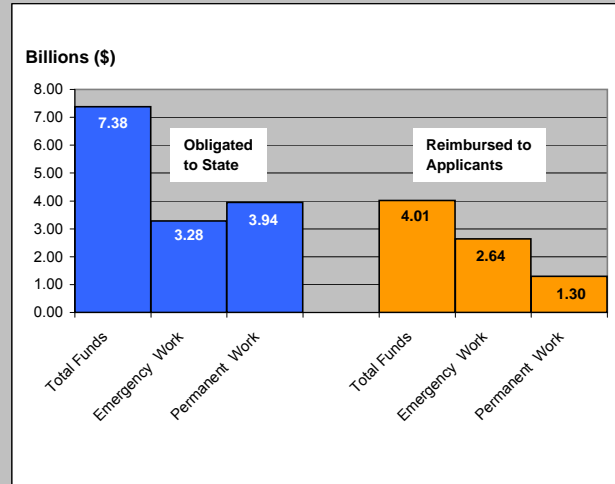

Summary of State-Wide PA Funding



Continued Support of Louisiana Recovery FEMA Public Assistance Weekly Update

- Over \$130K in Public Assistance funding was obligated to Cameron Parish for building repair to the Cameron Parish Vehicle Maintenance Facility, the Annex Building and the Cameron Parish District Attorney's Office. Funding was also obligated for content, furniture and equipment replacement for Grand Chenier Fire Station, Creole Fire Department, Cameron Parish Sheriff and Investigator's Office, Cameron Parish Police Jury, Cameron Parish District Attorney's Office and Holly Beach Fire Station.
- Over \$330K in Public Assistance funding was obligated to St Bernard Parish for the demolition of the old Health Unit building and for sanitary sewer system cleaning and CCV.
- Over \$550K in Public Assistance funding was obligated to Slidell for Repairs to the Violet and the Dravo wastewater treatment plants and for repairs to lift stations.
- Over \$1.3M in Public Assistance funding was obligated to Cameron Parish Sheriff's Department for building repairs and equipment and contents replacement.
- Over \$5.5M in Public Assistance funding was obligated to the City of New Orleans for street repair throughout the city and for the Crime Lab for the leasing of
