

- Post 1789 Toll roads emerge to meet the needs of commerce and mobility
- 1916 The Federal-aid Road Act signed by President Wilson
- 1944 President Roosevelt signs designation act
- 1954 President Eisenhower envisions the Interstate Highway System
- Clay Committee appointed to study the options

### Recommendations

- -\$101 billion in highway needs
- Federal share \$30 billion over ten years
- Interstate System \$27 billion of the total
- Financed by bonds sold by Federally created corporation
- Gas tax used to pay the bonds off


- 1955-Congress acts and defeats the proposal 2 to 1
- 1956- Congress abandons the Bond approach
  - -Creates the Highway Trust Fund
  - Authorizes \$27 billion of for the InterstateSystem
  - -Gas tax increased by 1 cent 1959

## Gas Tax History


- -Increased by 5 cents 1982
- -Increased by 5 cents 1990 ½ deficit reduction
- Increased by 4.3 cents 1993 deficit reduction
- 1998 transferred to the HTF

## PROGRAM CHANGES


- -ISTEA 1991 Changed the program
