

Roger M. Vogler, P.E. Chief, Engineering Division



Roger M. Vogler serves as Chief of the Engineering Division for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Transatlantic Programs Center in Winchester, Virginia. This division is one of three major divisions within the Center responsible for accomplishing projects that meet customer requirements. In this position, Mr. Vogler is responsible for overseeing and providing all design services and technical requirements for projects throughout the Middle East, Africa, and other areas, including certain contingency operations projects in the region.

From March through October 2007, Mr. Vogler served as the Center's Acting Deputy for Programs and Project Management, where he served as the senior civilian responsible for the organization's overall project execution. Previously, Mr. Vogler was the director of Engineering and Construction – Technical at the Center. He was responsible for and managed design services and construction support for the Transatlantic Programs Center.

Before his assignments at the Transatlantic Programs Center, Mr. Vogler served as the Chief of the Military Integration Division in the Corps of Engineers' Great Lakes and Ohio River Division from August 2002 through April 2005. Mr. Vogler had responsibility for programmatic oversight and leadership of the division's military, hazardous, toxic and radioactive waste and interagency support programs totaling more than \$500 million in annual project work. He also deployed to Iraq with Task Force Restore Iraqi Electricity as the senior program manager for the \$1 billion program.

His Corps of Engineers assignments have included resident engineer for the Huntsville Engineering and Support Center's Chemical Demilitarization Program at the Umatilla and Pine Bluff Resident Offices; resident engineer in Wuerzburg, Germany, where he was responsible for supporting six Army Base Support Battalions throughout southern Germany; area engineer for the Detroit Area Office; and project engineer and Support for Others program coordinator for Detroit District. He began his Corps of Engineers career with the Detroit District in June 1992.

Mr. Vogler, commissioned an engineer officer through Officer Candidate School in 1985, spent his seven-year military career in construction battalions, including commanding an engineer company during Operation Desert Storm.

He has a bachelor's degree in chemical engineering from the University of Michigan, a master's degree in engineering administration from George Washington University, and a master's degree in Hazardous Waste Management from Wayne State University.

He is a registered professional engineer in the state of Ohio, a certified Project Management Professional, and a member of the Army Acquisition Corps.
