Her work focuses on U.S.-China relations as well as China-Japan relations. She specializes in international negotiations/conflict and crisis management.

Before joining INSS, she served as commanding officer of a submarine support base at La Maddalena, Italy. She also served on the Joint Staff, J-5 as member of the negotiating team for various arms control treaties. In Japan, she served as Plans and Policy Chief for Commander, U.S. Naval Forces Japan. Her other assignments include base commander, Kamiseya, Japan; executive officer, AEGIS Training Center, Dahlgren, Virginia; politicomilitary officer, OSD Strategic Defense Initiative Organization, International and Government Affairs (negotiations); and she completed an internship on the Joint Staff in J-8 (Force Development) during the Goldwater-Nichols transition. Most recently, CAPT Louie served on the faculty of the National War College, NDU, where she taught courses on national security strategy, the global arena, Northeast Asia and wrote a new curriculum on international negotiations for strategists. She is certified as a Joint Specialty Officer.

CAPT Louie earned her B.S. in Applied and Theoretical Linguistics from Georgetown University in 1975, M.Ed. from Howard University in 1977, and M.A. in International Law and Diplomacy from the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy in 1997. She graduated from the Japanese Maritime Command and Staff College in 1990. CAPT Louie also completed the Peoples' Republic of China PLA NDU International Symposium Course in 2001 and is a member of the Class of 2001 at the National War College.
