UID-RFID Relationship

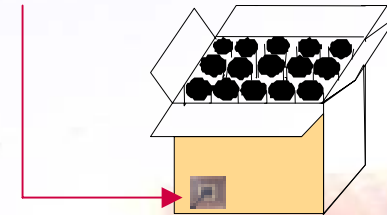
RFID Tags are attached to packages to increase in transit visibility. UID Data Matrices are attached to items to increase item traceability and valuation.



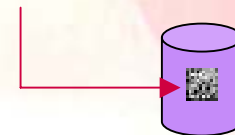
RFID Tag (Pallet Level)
