

It's very satisfying to know we're putting people to work as they help improve basic services in their neighborhoods.

This job is more than meeting my expectations. One of the pleasant surprises was to see that our living conditions weren't as "rustic" as I'd imagined. The food is great and we each have our own room, TV, and refrigerator. It's a very comfy place to go home at night, especially with some personal touches like a rug on the floor and my own microwave.
