Looking back at the last 12 months, our Office has turned over to the Government of Iraq 40 construction projects valued at over \$400 Million. These critical infrastructure projects provide essential services such as water treatment facilities, schools, electricity, health clinics, hospitals, roads and bridges to the people of Iraq. I'm proud to have been a part of a team of Military, Civilian, and Iraqi Engineering professionals during this historic mission, creating a brighter future and making a difference in the lives of Iraqi people.

I've witnessed first hand the ultimate sacrifice that comes with these assignments. I've personally experienced rocket, mortar, and improvised explosive device attacks. In the past year, I made over 200 Quality Assurance Construction site visits outside the wire. On two separate occasions my convoy was attacked with IED's resulting in casualties. During these site visits you sometimes wonder why you volunteered to come to such a dangerous place. Then you see the smiles


