I saw the Great Pyramids in Cairo with my first military overseas deployment in 1981 and have returned to the Middle East 25 years later and seen the Ziggurat by Iraq. Having processed over 1200 Soldiers from my Home Station for deployment in support of the Global War on Terrorism since 11 September 2001, it wasn't a question of if I would be deployed; rather when.

I could not have picked a better assignment if I tried, even though more is done here in a week than is attempted in a month in the States. In addition to completing daily reports and maintaining construction database integrity, being the

Baghdad Area Office NCOIC included the duties of providing for the transportation, life support, and welfare of 27 US civilian and military personnel stationed at 6 different locations throughout Baghdad Province. With the assistance of 78 Iraqi Associates, our Resident Offices completed 288 projects valued at \$330 million and started another 226 projects valued at \$285 million over the last 12 months.

When you consider that there is no Home Depot just down the street (in fact most of the construction material and equipment is imported), it is amazing that we have provided so many schools, fire stations, health clinics, roads, sewer systems, water systems, and electricity lines to the very appreciative people of Iraq.
