

Celebrating U.S. Constitution, The U.S. and Its Soldiers With Children's Songs

TALLIL, Iraq—Mitch Peterson, a program analyst with the Gulf Region South district of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, received an email the other day from his sister-in-law back in California and they'd both like to share the contents of that email with others here in Iraq.
