412th Engineer Command completes mission, 416th En Command assumes duties at Gulf Region Division

Baghdad, Iraq – Today at a ceremony in the International Zone, the Headquarters & Headquarters Detachment of the 412th Engineer Command, based in Vicksburg, Miss., relinquished command to the 416th Engineer Command, coming in from Darien, III. Both units are major subordinate commands of the United States Army Reserve Command.

First Lt. Justin Green, the outgoing HHD commander, passed the unit guidon to Capt. Brandon Crull, the incoming commander, in an afternoon ceremony overseen by Col. Paul Legere, the Gulf Region Division Chief of Staff.

Soldiers from the 416th are relieving approximately seventy 412th Army Reserve soldiers, who are supporting the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Gulf Region Division and its North, Central and South districts. GRD's mission includes rebuilding the critical and long neglected infrastructure of Iraq, establishing the facilities necessary to provide basic services such as electricity, water, health and education.

Maj. Gen. Michael Eyre, commanding general of the Gulf Region Division, and his Command Sgt. Maj. Richard Prater were in attendance, along with members of the GRD team.

The 412th Engineer Command soldiers are due to redeploy shortly and will return to Camp Shelby in Hattiesburg, Miss., for demobilization.

The Gulf Region Division, headquartered in Baghdad, is a joint effort comprised of nearly 600 Civilians, Soldiers, Sailors and Airmen. GRD provides quality and sustainable engineering in support of civil/military construction in Iraq. With more than 4,000 projects valued at \$6.9 billion already complete and another \$2.6 billion for approximately 400 projects underway, GRD and its Iraqi partners are building a strong foundation for Iraq's future.
