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## Avian Influenza

Why be interested or concerned about Tundra Swans (Cygnus c. columbianus)

### **Viral susceptibility**

- Tundra swans can carry pathogenic avian influenza viruses Japan (C. columbianus bewickii)
- Tundra swans can serve as intermediate hosts of pathogenic avian influenza viru Ito (2001) experimental re-innoculations of *C. columbianus bewickii* led to creation of high path from a low path strain.
- Swans (Cygnus spp.) are indicator species of outbreaks of HP H5N1

Bewick's swan (C. columbianus bewickii)

Whooper swan (C. cygnus bewickii)

Mute swan (C. olor)

#### Potential for transport of Al viruses

- Tundra swans are known to breed in eastern Siberia
- Tundra swans migrate to diverse wintering areas in North America
- Tundra swans use areas in proximity to important poultry regions such as the Central Valley of California.





Figure 1. Breeding distribution of Tundra Swans, showing overlap with Bewick's Swans in eastern Asia (from Kondratiev 1991, and Limpert and Earnst 1994, Syroechkovskiy).









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
