

Iraq Relief and Reconstruction Fund (IRRF)

Authorized by Congress in 2003 to jumpstart the rebuilding and reform processes in Iraq; funded projects in security, infrastructure, democracy programs, health, education, and other reconstruction \$12.8B to date

Economic Support Fund (ESF)

Designed to further support Iraq's reconstruction; used for sustaining infrastructure; political and economic programs, strengthening democracy and civil society, private sector and agricultural development, and ensuring the rule of law; support for the regional Crimes Liaison Office \$1.3B to date

Commanders Emergency Response Program (CERP & I-CERP)

Enables Commanders to apply Gol (ICERP) and USG (CERP) funds toward urgent humanitarian relief, infrastructure projects and economic development initiatives across fifteen provinces to exclude the Kurdish Region. To date total funds received are \$426.7M CERP and \$9.8M ICERP with anticipated program amounts of \$590 CERP and \$270M ICERP

Iraq Security Forces Fund (ISFF)

Authorized to fund training, equipment, life support, and sustainment of Iraqi Security Forces; can be used for construction, force protection, training, equipment, and sustainment \$728.3M to date

Global War on Terror (GWOT)

Provide resources required to support the operational requirements of the GRD HQs which includes personnel, deployment costs, a portion of the Logistics Directorate operation, and life support and security for the Division and Districts

Reconstruction

Construction projects used to improve and repair the infrastructure of Iraq

Non-Construction

Procurement of materials such as vehicles, weapons, medical equipment, supplies, etc.

Operations and Maintenance

Assist in sustaining essential service infrastructure by providing in-plant services, consumables, and spare parts at major facilities and plants

Capacity Development

A broad range of activities to train, equip, and prepare individuals to accept, budget for, manage, operate, and maintain new or reconstructed infrastructure facilities on a sustainable basis

Materials and Services in Support of Reconstruction

Materials and services that directly support a reconstruction project, such as supplies and equipment

Subordinate Project, Phase, Activity

Indicates additional work for an existing reconstruction project, either as a separate phase, additional utilities work, etc.



Qudas - Gas Turbine Generator #9

There are 8 transmission projects in progress valued at \$151.1M as of 5 Dec 08. The forecasted completion date of transmission work is 30 Sep 09. The Ghammas Substation will be the last to complete.





The Qudas Power Plant Expansion will strengthen the Baghdad Ring and serve 180,000 - 235,000 homes. The contractor is striving to provide power to the grid with one GTG operating on distillate fuel by end of CY08 & with the second GTG in same status by Jan 09.



Work is now completed connecting Haditha Substation Baghdad Bay to West Baghdad.

Oil Reconstruction Overview









Two 13,680m³/hr pumps (picture above) are in transit through South Africa to the Karbala Drainage Pump Station (picture to the left) located in Iraq's south-central Karbala governorate. The pump station has a design capacity of 54,720m³/hr, and is currently pumping 41,040m³/hr with three pumps operating and two in standby. The new pumps are spares to be utilized as needed.



The Sadr City R3 WTP Project is complete with the exception of a couple outstanding punchlist items. The BWA is currently operating the plant at full capacity (96,000 m³/day) with the support of a USG funded Advise and Assist team that provides O&M assistance as needed. The picture to the left depicts plant staff receiving on-the-job training in the proper use of self-contained breathing apparatuses.
