

A security report from Abu Azam indicates that a series of break-ins were executed in Hadithah, Baghdadi, and Hit. The targets of these break-ins were post offices, with an apparent goal of cutting off communication by taking the phone switch boards. The break-ins appear to be synchronized. It is also mentioned that cables were cut as well, and to keep an eye on the post offices to see if anything is repaired and to “follow up” with the post offices if they are repaired, more than likely implying to keep the post offices disabled.

Subject: Security report regarding telephone operator switches in Hadithah, Baghdad, Hit.

Our people sent someone to take the phone cards from the phone switches at Hadithah post office and we have the cards now

--Al Baghdadi: Abu Adam and Abu Ibrahim in connection with some people in Al-Baghdad, entered the post office at 930PM and took the phone cards, and a computer that records calls. When they entered, no guards were present.

--Hit: Abu-Husayn, and a group of our people from Al-Ahwal area took the phone cards and they have them now.

All post offices in Hadithah, Hit and Al-Baghdadi do not work

2. Make sure you take the phone cards from the people in Al-Ahwal because they might return them back to the post office.
3. Our people did cut off the cable lines and burned them to make sure it does not work
4. Follow up with post office if the phone switches are fixed.
