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Coastal engineering panel to meet in Long Branch

NEW YORK -- The Coastal Engineering Research Board, which provides guidance to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for coastal engineering research, will meet Oct. 11 and 12 in Long Branch, N.J.

The CERB meeting is open to the public. The meeting will be hosted by the U.S. Army Engineer Division, North Atlantic, and the U.S. Army Engineer District, New York, and will be held in the Ocean Place Resort and Spa, One Ocean Boulevard.

The CERB is a congressionally authorized advisory board that provides policy guidance and review of plans and funding requirements for coastal research and development to the chief of the Corps of Engineers. The board usually meets semiannually at various coastal and Great Lakes locations. The CERB is comprised of four Corps of Engineers senior officers and three civilian engineers or scientists who are experts in the field of coastal engineering.
