- **Curriculum adjustments:**

Cadets (except engineering majors) take two years foreign language

- **Academic Individual Advanced Development:**

60 of 500+ summer AIADs = immersion in 36 nations

- **Foreign Academy Exchange Program (FAEP):**

60 cadets spent spring break at 27 foreign military academies

- **Semester Abroad Program:** In 07-08, 140 cadets will study language/culture in 10 nations including China, Morocco, and Egypt.
