

Managing the Lake

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers manages the 55 square miles of land and water at Rathbun Lake. Land management practices include native prairie reestablishment, controlled burning, tree planting, and restricted vehicle access on 22,900 acres of public lands. These practices not only help conserve soil and benefit wildlife but also provide outdoor recreation opportunities for birders, hikers, hunters, fisherman, and wildlife viewers. Parking areas are located at various locations that provide foot access to Rathbun Lake's of public lands.

The Corps also manages six park areas for day use activities, camping, swimming, fishing and boating access. Additional facilities and campsites have been developed to meet the increasing needs of the lake visitor. The Corps strives to maintain its park areas and facilities to meet the needs of its visitors. Concessionaires operate two marinas and two camp areas.

14,500 acres of land for wildlife management, 375 acres for operation of Rathbun Fish Hatchery and Fisheries Research Facility, and two state parks, Honey Creek State Park and Honey Creek Resort Park are licensed to Iowa Department of Natural Resources from the Corps. Additional wetlands are being established on DNR licensed ground on the South Fork of the Chariton River.

- Rathbun Lake was dedicated in 1971 by President Richard Nixon
- The initial cost to construct Rathbun Dam was \$26 million.


