ERIC Adds RSS, Journal Updates and More

ERIC is pleased to announce the addition of several significant new features and updates to the www.eric.ed.gov Web site. These additions, which enhance the major site redesign released in August, include:

- RSS feeds
- Journal list update and downloadable file
- Thesaurus 'Summer 2008' update
- Tutorial additions

These enhancements reflect ERIC's continued commitment to ensuring growth of the ERIC Collection, currency of the ERIC Thesaurus, and Web site features and tools that aid the rapid discovery and use of ERIC materials.

RSS Feeds are available on Featured Publications and Search Results pages to help researchers and education sites locate the latest content. You can:

- Subscribe to custom feeds based on your search criteria
- Access fresh content matching your interests as it is added to the ERIC Collection

Journal List Enhancements

ERIC's journal coverage has grown to more than 825 titles. The enhancements to the journal list include:

- A <u>downloadable file</u> listing each currently indexed journal including include the title, ISSN, type of coverage (comprehensive or selective), and peerreviewed status
- New and reinstated titles added to the browsable list on the ERIC Web site
