

JAMIE L. WHITTEN HISTORICAL CENTER AND PARK

The Jamie L. Whitten Historical Center and Park is operated by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. This area is located in Itawamba County just off of John Rankin Highway on the east side of the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway. This park contains three large covered shelters, other single uncovered picnic tables with grills, boat ramp, multi-use court, playground area, fishing pier, hiking trail, restrooms, visitor center, campground and beach for campers.
