

SUMTER RECREATION AREA

Sumter Recreation Area is operated by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and is located in Sumter County, Alabama on the West Bank of Tennessee-Tombigbee, off of AL Highway 17, just off of Pickens/Sumter County Road 85, near Heflin Spillway West Bank. Facilities include a restroom, boat ramp, and a covered shelter. Other single uncovered picnic tables with grills are also available. Primitive Camping is allowed for a fee.
