David Armitage is an adjunct visiting research fellow at INSS, where he focuses on European constabulary capabilities and the role of the European Union in conflict stabilization and reconstruction. From September until December 2004, he was a visiting senior research fellow at INSS, where he conducted research on the European Gendarmerie Force and implications for NATO. Dr. Armitage also has served as the principal analyst for European Union affairs in the State Department's Bureau of Intelligence and Research since 2001. Previously, he worked at the Defense Department, where he was responsible for military-economic analysis in Europe and for managing analyses of long-term defense resource trends.

He has written on NATO enlargement, defense spending and military restructuring, the effects of globalization on the defense industry, political dynamics of the European Union, US-European counter-terrorism cooperation since September 11, and European contributions to post-conflict stabilization operations. His articles have been published in the United States, Germany, France, and Italy. He also has given presentations or lectured at New York University, University of Maryland, University of Washington, University of Pittsburgh, the National Defense University, Armed Forces Staff College, the US Foreign Service Institute, the Heritage Foundation, and the Evangelische Akademie in Germany.

Dr. Armitage holds a Ph.D. in Government and Politics from the University of Maryland, College Park, and an M.A. in International Affairs from the American University's School of International Service. During his career, he has received numerous sustained superior performance awards as well as several of the State Department's Meritorious Honor Awards.
