Dr. Ellen L. Frost is an Adjunct Research Fellow at INSS and a Visiting Fellow at the Institute for International Economics (IIE). She is the co-editor of ***The Global Century: Globalization and National Security***, Volumes 1 & II, June 2001, with Richard Kugler, NDU Press.

Dr. Frost served as a Senior Fellow, Institute for International Economics (1991-93, 1995-98) and was Counselor to the U.S. Trade Representative (USTR) from February 1993 to June 1995. She was previously Corporate Director for International Affairs in the Washington office of United Technologies Corporation (1988-91), Director for U.S.-Japan Relations in the Washington office of Westinghouse Electric Corporation (1981-88), and Deputy Assistant Secretary for International Economic and Technology Affairs at the Department of Defense. Her government experience includes positions within the Treasury Department (1974-77), the Senate (1972-74), and the Department of State (1963). She is the author of several articles and books, including ***Transatlantic Trade: A Strategic Agenda***, published in May 1997 by the Institute for International Economics; and ***For Richer, For Poorer: The New U.S.-Japan Relationship***, published in 1987 by the Council on Foreign Relations.

Dr. Frost is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations in New York, the International Institute for Strategic Studies in London, and the Public Diplomacy Council. She holds a Ph.D. degree from the Department of Government at Harvard University, awarded in 1972; an M.A. from the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy; and a B.A. from Radcliffe College.
