

WHITTEN CAMPGROUND



Whitten Campground is a U.S. Fee area operated by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers in Itawamba County. It is located on the east side of the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway in Fulton, Mississippi. From the intersection of US 78 and MS 25, go north on MS 25 for 200 yards and then turn north on Access Road for 4.5 miles. The campground is on the left side of the road within the Jamie L. Gate Attendants are on duty from 6:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m. The campground attendants lock gates to secure the area at 10:00 p.m.



Whitten Campground offers a variety of camping sites. All sites have an impact pad, picnic table and grill, fire ring, lantern post, water and electrical hookups.

Amenities include: laundry facilities, multi-use game courts, two playground areas, three concession buildings, three fishing piers, nearby boat ramp, three bathhouses, sanitary dump station, nature trails, nearby picnic shelters, and a swimming area complete with overlooking gazebo.



A Restroom and laundry building with concession building is located in each loop of the campground. The three bathrooms include hot showers and are handicap accessible.

Multi-use courts are nearby.

There are three fishing piers in the campground.
