In order to stimulate activities and reflection in honor of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. we highlight one of the heroic events in American history. In March of 1965 Dr. King led a group of 25,000 ordinary citizens and religious leaders in a march from Selma, Alabama to the state capital of Montgomery, Alabama, more than 50 miles away. The purpose of this march was to tell the story of the desire for freedom that is the shared heritage of all Americans.

Educators can access the famous James Karales photograph, *Selma-to Montgomery March for Voting Rights in 1965*, lesson plans, and background information within the Picturing America materials that were recently delivered to your school. The Karales photograph transcends its primary function as a record of the event and has become an icon of the civil rights movement. The content, theme, and composition of the image have solidified its place as one of the significant works of American art of the civil rights era. Video footage of the Selma to Montgomery March may be accessed via the High School Library Information Center database ProQuest History Study Center.
