**ProQuest: History Study Center** includes a Study Unit titled **America and the Civil Rights Movement** which contains topic overviews of the time period, primary source documents, maps, reference materials, photographic archives, multimedia and Web links. Items of particular interest include: video footage of the Selma civil rights march, newsreel footage of the 1963 March on Washington, and interviews with Martin L. King.

**ProQuest: SIRS Decades:** contains a topical outline of the 1960s which addresses Civil Rights.

**ProQuest: eLibrary CE** includes several primary source documents as well as magazine and newspaper articles.
