Prior to being assigned as the Afghanistan Engineer District Deputy Commander in 2008, LTC Floyd served as the AED Area Engineer in Herat, Afghanistan. There, LTC Floyd managed 42 projects valued at nearly \$150M in support of the Global War on Terror, helping bring security and facilitate reconstruction in the five western provinces of Afghanistan.

He received an early commission as a Second Lieutenant in May 1985, and graduated with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Civil Engineering from Mississippi State University in December 1986. Since then, he has held numerous active duty, reserve and civilian positions in the engineering field to include: Platoon Leader, 317<sup>th</sup> Engineer Battalion, Eschborne, West Germany; Executive Officer, Headquarters and Headquarters Company V Corps in Frankfurt, Germany; Company Commander of B-Co., 2<sup>nd</sup> BN 39<sup>th</sup> Infantry, 4<sup>th</sup> Bde. in Fort Jackson, SC; AC/RC Engineer Trainer, 493<sup>rd</sup> Eng. Group, USAR in Dallas and Project Engineer, U.S. Army Corps of Engineer District in Fort Worth, TX.

In addition to this current assignment, LTC Floyd has served on three other deployments. One as a Project Manager with the Trans-Atlantic Program Center-Europe to Bosnia-Herzegovina; another as the Director of Public Works with Facility Engineer Team 12 at Camp Able Sentry in Kosovo, and another as the Deputy Director of Public Works with Facility Engineer Team 17 in Bagram, Afghanistan. After leaving active duty in 1997, he has served as a USACE civilian Project Engineer, Resident Engineer, and Project Manger with the Fort Worth District.

His military training includes United States Marine Corps Boot Camp, Parris Island, SC; USMC Infantry Training School, Camp Lejeune, NC; Engineer Officer Basic Course, Ft. Belvoir, VA; Engineer Officer Advanced Course, Ft. Leonard Wood, MO; Combined Arms Service Staff School Ft. Leavenworth, KS; and completion of phase 1 of the Command and General Staff College.

LTC Floyd's military decorations include the Bronze Star Medal, the Meritorious Service Medal (3 OLC), the Army Commendation Medal (3 OLC), the Army Achievement Medal, the National Defense Service Medal (1BS), the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, the Kosovo Campaign Medal, the Armed Forces Service Medal, the Afghanistan Campaign Medal, and the NATO Medal (2<sup>nd</sup> Award).
