PREFACE

The President's Fiscal Year (FY) 2007 budget for the Civil Works program of the Army Corps of Engineers proposes funding for the continued development and restoration of the Nation's water and related resources, operation and maintenance of existing Federally owned water resources projects, protection of the Nation's waters and wetlands, and restoration of sites contaminated as a result of the Nation's early atomic weapons development program. The budget gives high priority to the Corps' primary water resources mission areas, namely, commercial navigation, flood and coastal storm damage reduction, and aquatic ecosystem restoration.

The budget provides gross discretionary funding for the Army Civil Works program of \$4.733 billion. This total comprises: \$3.791 billion from the general fund; \$707 million from the Harbor Maintenance Trust Fund; \$197 million from the Inland Waterways Trust Fund; \$37 million from Special Recreation User Fees; and \$1 million from Disposal Facilities User Fees. Additional sources of funding are estimated at \$538 million, including \$445 million contributed in cash by non-Federal interests.

In recent years, many more construction projects have been authorized, initiated, and continued than can be constructed efficiently. This has led to the postponement of benefits from the most worthy projects, which has significantly reduced overall program performance. To remedy this situation and to achieve greater value to the Nation from the Civil Works construction program, the budget focuses funding on projects that yield the greatest economic and environmental return. Work on low priority projects would be considered for suspension, and for those projects the budget provides funding either to complete each ongoing contract, or to terminate it and pay the Federal share of settled claims, whichever is estimated to be less costly.

The budget again proposes seven performance guidelines to allocate funds among construction projects. Allocations are based primarily on the remaining economic benefits of projects relative to their remaining costs, their contributions to reducing life-threatening inundation hazards, and the extent to which they cost-effectively contribute to the restoration of nationally or regionally significant aquatic ecosystems where the ecosystems have become degraded as a result of Civil Works projects or to a restoration effort for which the Corps is uniquely well suited. The funded construction projects include six considered to be national priorities; fourteen projects in their final year of construction (including one resumption and one dam safety project); ten other dam safety, seepage, and static instability correction projects; one newly funded project; and sixty other ongoing projects.

The budget reflects a stepped-up emphasis on natural disaster preparedness and response. First, the budget provides \$20 million for a national inventory and data base of flood and storm damage reduction projects, and for developing and testing methods to assess project structural and operational integrity and the associated risks. Second, the budget provides \$81 million for planning, preparedness, and response to flood and storm emergencies, and for rehabilitation of damaged flood and storm damage reduction projects. In conjunction with this initiative, the Corps will also continue an ongoing risk assessment for its portfolio of dams.

The Regulatory Program receives a \$15 million increase over Fiscal Year 2006 appropriations. This funding will enable the program to continue to improve the effectiveness of aquatic resource protection and the efficiency of permit reviews and decision-making.

As was proposed last year, the budget includes funding for authorized beach renourishment to replace sand lost due to Federal navigation operation and maintenance. These costs would be 100 percent Federal. The budget does not provide funding for Federal participation in renourishment to combat natural erosion.

The budget for navigation maintenance and rehabilitation continues to give priority to those harbors and waterway segments that support high volumes of commercial traffic. Maintenance and rehabilitation work on the heavily-used Upper Mississippi, Ohio, and Illinois waterways receives substantial funding. The budget also funds harbors that support significant commercial fishing, subsistence, or public transportation benefits.

The budget provides \$267 million for operation and maintenance of recreation areas. The budget also proposes that the costs of upgrades and modernizations be financed from new fees and partnership arrangements.

The budget proposes to fund four types of operation and maintenance-related activities in the Operation and Maintenance account, rather than in the Construction account as has been the case in the recent past. First, the Operation and Maintenance account would fund activities to comply with the Endangered Species Act at operating projects, principally in the Columbia and Missouri River Basins. The compliance costs would be allocated among the project purposes of the operating projects. Second, the account would fund rehabilitation of existing projects. Rehabilitation work would compete for funding on a level playing field with other operation and maintenance activities. Third, the account would fund the construction of facilities, projects or features (including islands and wetlands) that use maintenance dredging material. Fourth and finally, funding in the account would be used to replace sand lost from shores due to the operation of Federal navigation projects. It is appropriate to fund these activities in the Operation and Maintenance account, both because of the nature of the work they represent and because of their integral connection to operation and maintenance.

The budget proposes to fund the Office of the Assistant Secretary of the Army (Civil Works) from the Expenses account.

The budget proposes to use a portion of unobligated funds carried over from Fiscal Year 2006 to begin to repay the Department of the Treasury's Judgment Fund. The repayments would be for those past judgments against the United States on Civil Works contracts and real estate acquisitions financed by the Judgment Fund.

The budget includes initiatives leading to more systematic, performance-based budget development and asset management. Many of these initiatives are in response to program assessments using the Program Assessment Rating Tool, or PART. For instance, to improve investment decision making, the budget funds the development of economic models for navigation and benefit evaluation methods for aquatic ecosystem restoration. The budget provides funding to develop asset management systems and risk-based condition indices for operating projects. These analytical tools are necessary to help evaluate maintenance and rehabilitation choices for flood and storm damage reduction, navigation, and hydropower assets more strategically. The budget organizes budget information for operation and maintenance activities by river basin and by mission area, setting the stage for improved management of Civil Works assets in FY 2007 and more systematic budget development in future years.

This budget represents the prudent use of funding to advance important, mission-based objectives. I am proud to present it.

U.S. Army Corps of Engineers FY 2007 Budget Justification Materials Recreation Initiative

The Corps is the largest Federal provider of outdoor recreation services. Over 4,300 recreation areas are located on Corps managed lands at 456 projects in 43 states. The Corps has long been a leader in developing partnerships to assist in providing recreation opportunities. For this reason, about 1800 (43 percent) of these recreation areas are operated and maintained by other entities, such as states and local governments, under a lease or license agreement. Water oriented recreation is attractive to visitors, and Corps sites and facilities serve millions of people each year. Eighty percent of Corps projects are located within 50 miles of a major metropolitan area, making the recreation opportunities easily accessible to many Americans. For example, Lewisville Lake near Dallas, Texas attracts large numbers of visitors, as does J. Percy Priest Lake near Nashville, Tennessee. The 2007 Budget includes \$267 million for the recreation program.

The 2007 Budget proposes a Corps recreation modernization initiative, using a promising model now used by other major federal recreation providers such as the National Park Service and the Forest Service. The Administration has proposed legislation to allow the agency to use a portion of the new fees it collects to upgrade the sites where the fees are collected. The legislation includes authority for the agency to charge entrance fees and other types of user fees where appropriate.

The Corps expects the recreation modernization initiative will result in increased recreation fee receipts that will be used to upgrade and modernize recreation sites and facilities, to assure that quality public outdoor recreation opportunities may be provided on Corps lands into the future. In conjunction with this proposal, the Corps plans to work closely with the Congress and with local communities neighboring Corps lakes to determine how best to implement and build on this initiative. The Corps will focus on the following areas of interest:

- The Corps currently collects a variety of fees and user charges, including overnight camping fees, day-use fees, and fees for special events; lease payments paid by concessionaires including marinas; shoreline use permit fees; and agricultural lessees' fee payments. The agency will review its current authorities, and make appropriate adjustments if it finds revisions can improve program quality.
- New management arrangements may offer local leaders increased opportunities to partner with the Corps in operating the lakes.
 Innovative public/private partnerships with organizations such as Lake Improvement Districts may provide models the Corps could modify or adopt, as appropriate. These arrangements will be designed to encourage local community leaders, property owners and environmental groups to work with the Corps on this effort collaboratively, consistent with the approach taken in the President's cooperative conservation program.
- The Corps now works closely with state and local officials. It also works extensively with volunteers, other stakeholders and interest groups. The agency may elect to expand these activities.

The agency looks forward to working together with local stakeholders and with their representatives in Congress to develop improved ways of doing business, being responsive to stakeholders, while assuring quality outdoor recreation opportunities are available for the enjoyment of current and future generations of Americans.
