Zebra Mussels have been identified in Bulls Shoals Lake!

Please read the following notice for instructions on how to protect our waters from these nuisance species.



Prevent the transport of nuisance species. Clean <u>all</u> recreational equipment. www.ProtectYourWaters.net

When you leave a body of water:

- Remove any visible mud, plants, fish or animals before transporting equipment.
- Eliminate water from equipment before transporting.
- Clean and dry anything that comes into contact with water (boats, trailers, equipment, clothing, dogs, etc.).
- Never release plants, fish or animals into a body of water unless they came out of that body of water.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is asking for your help stopping the spread of Zebra Mussels. Please keep your boats and equipment clean when going from Bull Shoals Lake to neighboring lakes or rivers. In addition to the steps above, we suggest that you power wash all boats and equipment before launching into a new body of water. Hot water above 140 degrees F from a high pressure sprayer is the preferred method of cleaning equipment. Remember that if we all do our part we can keep our waters clean for future generations to come.
