**TEFAP State Agencies** 

Two pieces of legislation currently dictate the level of food and administrative resources available to the Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) in FY 2009. On June 18, 2008, the Food, Conservation, and Energy Act of 2008 (the Farm Bill) was enacted into law. On September 30, 2008, the Consolidated Security, Disaster Assistance, and Continuing Appropriations Act, 2009 (the CR) was also enacted into law. The CR provides FNS with appropriations for its programs through March 6, 2009.

The Farm Bill *requires* USDA to expend \$250 million in FY 2009 for the purchase of TEFAP food. Such funds are non-discretionary, and will be available for TEFAP food purchases unless specific Congressional action is taken to reduce the amount available. Of the \$250 million, an estimated \$2,082,227 is needed to pay costs associated with ordering and transporting the food, leaving \$247,917,773 for the purchase of food.

In previous years, FNS has been authorized in annual appropriations bills to offer States the opportunity to convert their fair-share of \$10 million in TEFAP food funds into administrative funds. Because final appropriations for FY 2009 have not been enacted, it is unclear whether this authority will be retained, expanded, or terminated for FY 2009. For the time being, FNS is proceeding as though the authority will be retained at the \$10 million level. FNS is tentatively setting April 6, 2009 as the deadline for States to indicate to their Regions whether they want to accept their portion of the \$10 million as food funds, administrative funds, or any combination thereof.

The Farm Bill *authorizes* \$100 million for TEFAP administrative funds. However, these funds are discretionary, and the actual level of funding must therefore be established annually in an appropriations bill. Under the CR, states have been allocated \$21,354,465 in TEFAP administrative funds, a pro-rated portion of funds available in FY 2008 (\$49,650,000), to cover needs through March 6. Final appropriations action may result in a different level of TEFAP administrative funding. States will continue to have the option to convert any portion of their administrative funds into food funds. States should indicate to their Regions what portion of their administrative funds they wish to convert to food funds (if any) by June 1, 2009.

Worksheet #1 shows each State's allocation of FY 2009 TEFAP food funds, share of the \$10,000,000 in convertible food funds, and a column showing the total of these amounts. Worksheet #2, which FNS previously distributed via e-mail, shows each State's share of the \$21,354,465 in FY 2009 administrative funds provided under the CR.

Please note that all TEFAP food and administrative funds are subject to apportionment by the Office of Management and Budget. We will keep you informed regarding the availability of these funds.
