

JAMIE L. WHITTEN HISTORICAL CENTER

The Jamie L. Whitten Historical Center is operated by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. It is located near Fulton, Mississippi in Itawamba County, 4.2 miles north of the intersection of MS Highway 25 and US 78 on the North Access Road. Visitor Center hours of operation:

- November 1st – March 31st, 7:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m., Monday – Friday
- April 1st – May 25th, 7:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m., 7 days a week
- May 26th – August 31st, 8:30 a.m. – 5:00 p.m., 7 days a week
- September 1st – November 1st, 7:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m., 7 days a week

The Center was designed by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Mobile District, and contains exhibits from five other Federal agencies involved in the economic development of Northeast Mississippi. These include the Appalachian Regional Commission, Tennessee Valley Authority, USDA and Natural Resources Conservation Service, National Park Service and the U.S. Forest Service.





Guided tours are available for clubs, church groups, schools, or organizations that would like to tour the Whitten Center facilities without charge. All groups are urged to call ahead to avoid scheduling conflicts. The Center includes a 120-seat auditorium, which can be reserved. It contains tables and chairs and comes complete with audio/visual equipment, a small kitchen, and the terrace picnic area.
