

BRONCHOPROVOCATION TESTING INFORMATION SHEET Pulmonary Function Lab (202) 782-5737



Your doctor has ordered a test to evaluate you for the possibility of asthma.

There are several things you should know before the test:

 Certain medications can affect the results of your test. Discuss with your doctor whether you should stop these medication prior to your test. The recommended time to stop prior to the test is listed below:

Albuterol (Proventil, Ventolin), metaproterenol (Alupent),

12 hours

Terbutaline (Breathair), Cromolyn (Intal)

Ipratropium bromide (Atrovent), Montelukast (singulair)

24 hours

Salmeterol (Serevent), Nedocromil (Tilade), Theophylline

48 hours

(Theo-dur, slo-bid)

Prednisone, inhaled steroids (Azmacort, Flovent, Beclovent) 2-4 weeks Vanceril, Aerobid, Pulmicort, Advair, Budesonide)

- 2. **Avoid any type of caffeine products for at least 12 hours** prior to the test (ex: coffee, tea, chocolates, colas, energy drinks, etc).
- 3. Avoid heavy meals within 3 hours prior to the test to prevent nausea.
- 4. Please discuss any of the following conditions with your doctor prior to taking this test:

Recent cold or flu

Hypertension (high blood pressure) that is difficult to control

Heart attack or stroke in the last month

Aortic aneurysm

Myasthenia Gravis

Pregnancy or Nursing

Cigarette Smoking

- 5. The testing process will take approximately 1 hour to complete.
