- ...facilitates communication with Congress, the GAO, and other outside agencies








The Roadmap is a living document...



The Roadmap established objectives linked to goals, then identified initiatives and programs linked to objectives...







Defines a coherent framework for providing globally responsive, operationally precise, and costeffective logistics capabilities to support America's warfighters


Institutionalized continuous assessment and feedback

 - A chapter that lays out the next steps in Roadmap application and development
 - Six appendices that provide background and details
