## REPORT ON WIC FOOD COSTS - March 2007 DATA

## FOOD PRICE INDICES:

## 1. The Thrifty Food Plan Index:

Thrifty Food Plan (TFP) Costs are published monthly by the USDA Center for Nutrition Policy and Promotion. The cost index for the Food Stamp Program (FSP) reference household, a family of four, including two children ages 6-8 and 9-11, is used by FNS to calculate the inflation factor used to allocate WIC State food grants.

The cost of the Thrifty Food Plan for the FSP reference household was $\$ 536.90$ in March 2007, an increase of $\$ 19.70$ or 3.81 percent from March 2006 and an decrease of $-\$ 1.60$ or -0.30 percent from February 2007.

## 2. Consumer Price Index:

The Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) produces monthly consumer price data for food and other consumer goods. The Consumer Price Index for all Urban Consumers (CPI-U) for Food at Home is a measure of the average change in prices over time for a fixed market basket of retail foods purchased by consumers for day-today living. Food prices are collected every month in 85 urban areas across the country from about 19,000 retail establishments. The average food prices reflect variation in brand, quality, and size among geographical areas. The Consumer Price Index (CPI) measures price change from a base period, 1982-84, which equals 100.0. Thus, a CPI of 134.6 means that the price has increased 34.6 percent since the $1982-84$ base period.

The March 2007 CPI for "Food at Home" was 198.8, which is 0.3 percent higher than the February 2007 level, and 3.4 percent higher than one year before in March 2006.

## 3. Average Retail Prices:

BLS also reports U.S. average prices for selected foods, including the following components of the WIC food package:
