2008 RMAP Training Schedule

Regional Measurement Assurance Programs (RMAPs) coordinated by a regional host in cooperation with NIST. In 2008, RMAP training sessions will again be provided by NIST/WMD at no charge to participants. NIST Handbook 143 provides the basis for annual training requirements for State laboratories seeking WMD Recognition. Training topics (noted on page 2) are selected based on annual needs assessments; input is obtained during laboratory assessments, annual reviews of submitted data, and laboratory requests. WMD Metrology seminars are generally operated on a cost-recovery basis; however, costs to States are subsidized as a part of our support to State weights and measures agencies. Industry participation in the RMAP sessions is free, but is based on the membership arrangements of each RMAP charter.

Proficiency tests and interlaboratory comparisons (PTs/ILCs) are coordinated nationally and among each of the RMAP regions; PTs/ILCs follow the WMD Policy and Quality Manuals. States are eligible to participate in PTs/ILCs based on their Recognition status. Industry participation is limited to qualifying participants who have completed appropriate levels of NIST/WMD training and regularly attend the RMAP training sessions (according to the PT/ILC quality policy.) In addition to the regular training, PT/ILC discussions and planning sessions are a key activity of each RMAP session.
