

Nutrition Services Incentive Program

The Older American's Act Nutrition Programs are administered by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Service's (DHHS) [Administration on Aging www.aoa.gov](http://www.aoa.gov) under Part C-1, Congregate Nutrition Services, and Part C-2, Home-Delivered Nutrition Services, of Title III, and under Title VI. Under Section 311 of the OAA, NSIP rewards State Agencies on Aging and Indian Tribal Organizations that efficiently deliver nutritious meals to older adults.
