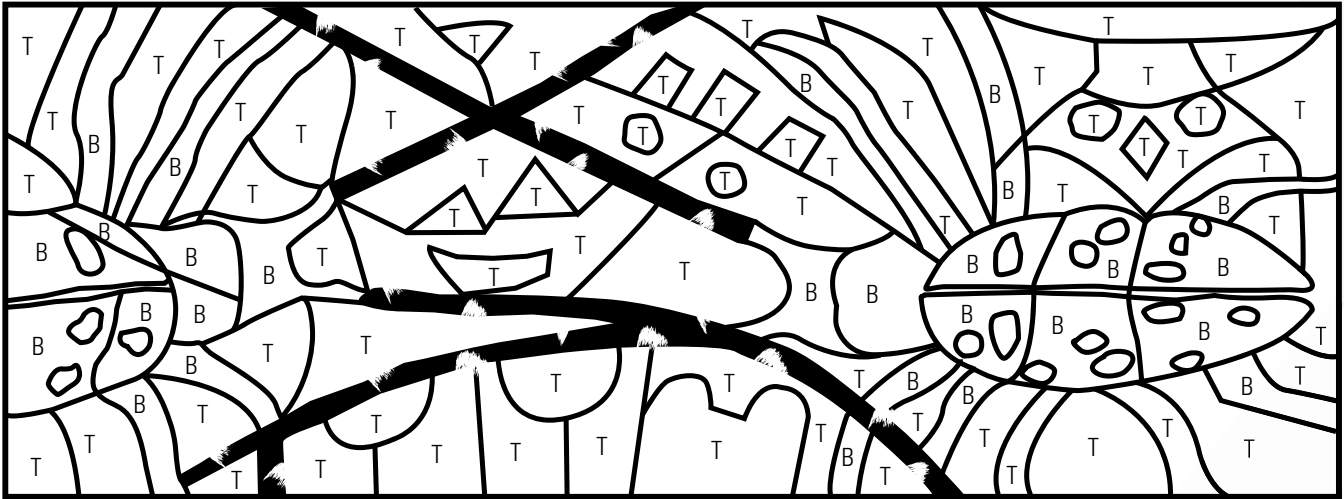

HIDDEN CRITTERS

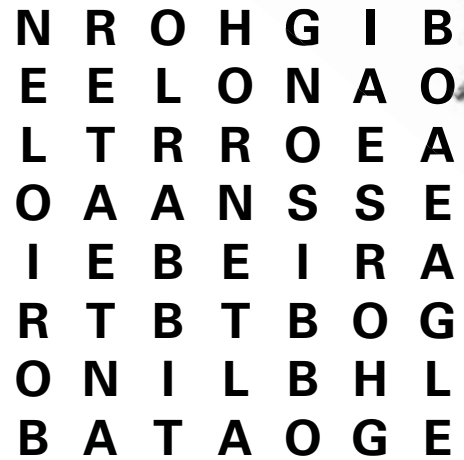
Find the hidden creatures by coloring the spaces:

WHAT DO THESE ANIMALS HAVE IN COMMON?

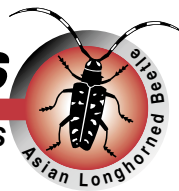

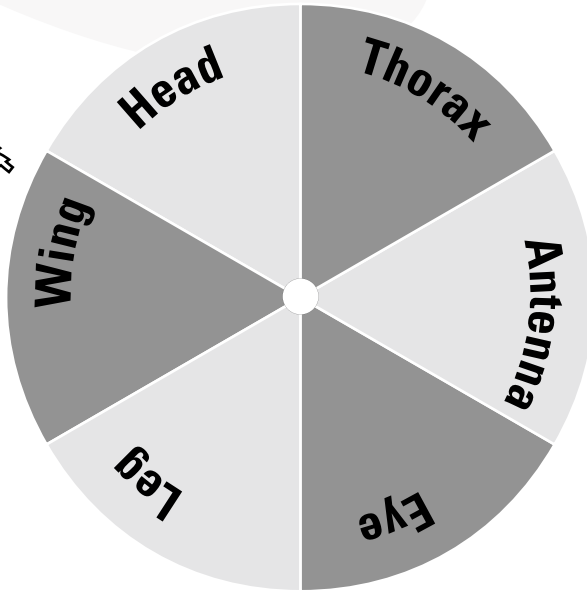
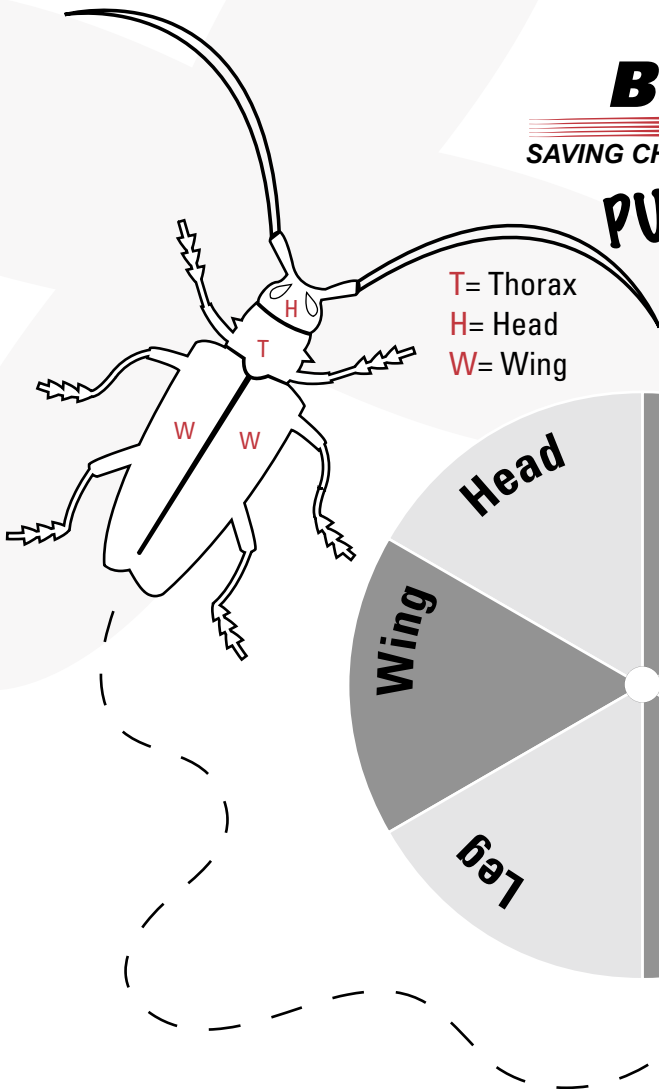
Write the three letters that you didn't circle in the puzzle in order (top to bottom, left to right).

BUILD A BEETLE

Play this game with a friend to see who can complete an Asian Longhorned Beetle first.

1. Each player needs a blank piece of paper. Sketch the beetle lightly on the paper with a pencil. Use a pencil point to hold a paper clip in the middle of the spinner. To spin, flick the paper clip with your finger.
2. Take turns spinning. Use a crayon or felt pen to color the beetle's body part that the spinner lands on. To complete the beetle, you have to land on EYE, ANTENNA, and WING two times and on LEG six times. If you land on a line, spin again. If you land on a body part you've already colored, you lose a turn.

3. Cross off the words with K, W, or Y in them.

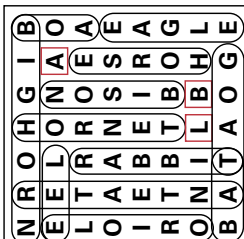
