DEPARTMENT OF THE TREASURY REPORT TO CONGRESS FY 2004 ACQUISITIONS FROM ENTITIES THAT MANUFACTURE ARTICLES, MATERIALS, OR SUPPLIES OUTSIDE OF THE UNITED STATES

Introduction

Section 645 of Public Law 108-199, the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2004, provides the annual reporting requirements for the Buy American Act and requires submission of a report to Congress on the amount of acquisitions made by the agency from entities that manufacture the articles, materials, or supplies outside of the United States in that fiscal year.

Summary

1. Dollar value of articles, materials, or supplies purchased that were manufactured outside of the United States:

Response: The Department of the Treasury purchased items totaling \$1,111 that were manufactured outside of the United States.

2. Itemized list of all waivers granted with respect to such articles, materials, or supplies under the Buy American Act (41 U.S.C. 10a et seq.):

Response: The Department of the Treasury granted no waivers under the Buy American Act in fiscal year 2004.

3. Summary of the total procurement funds spent on goods manufactured in the United States versus funds spent on goods manufactured outside of the United States:

Response: Goods manufactured in the United States \$1,246,089,126 Goods manufactured outside of the United States \$1,111

Note: Two contracts, one for \$562 and one for \$549, total \$1,111, were issued for items manufactured outside of the United States. No waivers were required because the Buy American Act is not applicable to actions below the micro-purchase threshold.
